Original Poem Project

For your final assignment of the quarter, you will be writing your own poetry.

Here are the project instructions.

- 1. Complete the Original Poem Brainstorming Worksheet to help you brainstorm ideas and devices.
- 2. You must write a poem (or poems) that together total at least 14 lines of poetry.
- 3. Your poem(s) must be typed, but you may be creative with your use of font, color, and shape.
- 4. Be prepared to share your poem(s) with the class on week 8.
- 5. Take this assignment seriously! Do not take advantage of a free form or unconventional style unless you are purposeful in this!
- 6. Part of your project grade will depend on how seriously you take the assignment, including the presentation of your poem.
- 7. Your 14 lines of poetry must include a total of at least 5 examples from the following categories:

simile slant rhyme metaphor internal rhyme imagery sight rhyme assonance rhyme scheme consonance symbolism allusion personification

onomatopoeia meter

8. Bring your poem brainstorming sheet and 2 typed copies of your final poem to class – make sure to annotate the copy you will turn in with the requirements (above).

Write a couple lines of poetry in free verse (no rhyme, no meter) or blank verse (unrhymed iambic pentameter).

Consider writing a specific type of poetry – quatrain (4-line stanza), sonnet (14 lines), haiku (3 lines). Look up specifics on each type of poetry for details on rhyme and meter if you plan to use these types. Or, be like a modernist and break the rules!
