1. Should use same page format (last name and page #) that you use for essay
2. "Works Cited" should be centered, using 12pt Times New Roman font that is set to double-spacing (no extra space, no bold / italics / underline)
3. Citations should be in alphabetical order based on the first word of the citation
4. Margins are the same as for essay (1 inch all around), but after 1st line of citation, proceeding lines should be indented ½ inch
