The Scarlet Letter Annotation Guide

Directions: Use the following guide to help you annotate *The Scarlet Letter*. Your annotations should be <u>detailed</u> and <u>thoughtful</u>. I'm looking for QUALITY and QUANTITY!! <u>Remember, you will be writing an essay on how Hawthorne uses literary elements throughout the novel to develop themes, characters or the <u>plot</u>. Focus on these areas in your annotation!</u>

As you read the novel, look for development of the following themes, symbols, and characters. I should see annotation for these things <u>frequently</u> through your text. <u>In addition, you should be keeping an index of themes/symbols in the back cover of your novel and the characters in the front cover.</u>

Themes:

- Sin
- Hypocrisy
- Identity & Society
- Revenge
- Justice & Judgement

Symbols:

- The scarlet letter
- The prison
- The scaffold
- Nature
- Sunlight
- Color

Characters:

- Hester Prynne
- Pearl
- Rev. Dimmesdale
- Roger Chillingworth
- The townspeople

You should also annotate for Hawthorne's use of literary elements. Here are some that you will see (this list is not exhaustive – can you find others?). <u>Keep an index of all literary elements in the back cover of your novel.</u>

Literary Elements:

- Tone
- Foreshadowing
- Suspense
- Mood
- Imagery
- Characterization

Other annotation ideas:

- Description of the setting
- Unfamiliar words (underline AND define)
- Connections to Early American Lit. elements
- 4 cornerstones of Romanticism

**In order to receive full credit on your annotations, you should have numerous annotations per page AND they should include a variety of different types of the annotations above!!
